Babbel

About

Babbel is a busy bee with music and music programs, playing the organ through the klavarskribo method and the rest through traditional music writing. She also plays other instruments such as: guitar, recorder and piano. She is currently organist in three churches in Friesland (NL) and sings and plays a lot at home. Perhaps somewhat amateurishly, but with great pleasure.

Every 3rd monday each month, Babbel streams Classical music from 12:00 ki in the Hall of Kings in Ae'gura.

Dah'mpa

About

I have always been involved with music but I play and sing just for fun. I started when I was 17, with classical guitar (classical music for the first few months, then moving on to Brazilian popular music). A few years later, I started learning percussion, also focused on Brazilian popular music, without abandoning the guitar. At the end of the 1980s, when I was living in Italy, I played for a few years in nightclubs with a Brazilian music group (in which I only played percussion).

In 2012, I started studying electric bass, with a primarily jazz repertoire. I played bass and classical guitar in a few bands (jazz and Brazilian popular music). That lasted a couple of years, until the pandemics. I had never dedicated myself to singing, except to accompany myself on the guitar, even if I did take part in a university choir (as a bass voice) during my PhD studies. Finally, in 2022, I found the Uru Karaoke community and since then I've come to regard my voice as a real instrument, just like the guitar, bass and percussion.

Edison Rex (Paul Harriman)

About

Paul Harriman built his first synthesizer in 1974 at the age of 14. A trained pianist, brass and recorder player, Paul played for many years with many regionally known bands around the New England music scene. While living in Vermont, Paul composed and played the music for locally written plays (Vermont Reperatory Theatre and Burlington's Green Candle Theatre) as well as playing in occasional sessions and sitting in on Burlington's music scene throughout the late 1980s and early 1990s.

Paul has had an electronic music studio in his house since the 1980s and continues to compose and play solo both on the internet and live. Now living in London, UK, Paul is part of the RadioSpiral.net family, operating the station, and his twice monthly two hour live performance called Edison's Ephemera, started in 2009 which plays alternate Saturdays at 3PM Pacific time.

Paul is also known on the internet as Edison Rex, a name that his jazz band instructor started to call him back in the 1970s when at the Berklee Jazz Competitions, Paul repaired his Wurlitzer 200A with a Swiss Army knife about 15 minutes before the competition. The name has stuck throughout the years and Paul can be found under this name online, in Second Life, and in the Opensim Hypergrids (and in MOULa where he is an 11-year veteran).

Paul's musical composition style has evolved over the years, and has lately been described as "progressive electronica". Paul is also committed to the use of alternative controllers for electronic music and counts an Eigenharp Alpha, Roland AE-30 and Linnstrument amongst his current gig rig. Last but not least, Paul is also one of the Dni'Js for Radio Free D'ni which plays every sunday in the cavern.

Jet Blast

About (excerpt from "Full-on French fun" by Peter Frankland)

Its set of covers included a broad range of music but with a definite slant toward rock. With such classics as AC/DC's "Back in Black", Led Zepplins's "Rock and Roll" and "Do Do He Police, they couldn't go far wrong, pleasing what few people were in the bar. And when Rage against Machine's anarchist anthem "Killing in the Name" was cranked out at full volume, they even managed to pull a couple of biker-style metal-heads to the front to vent their anger and punch their fists in the air in defiance. "I won't do what you tell me". Fantastic.

David Valee was on guitar and vocals with Maurice Boudoux in charge of bass and backing vocals and Sebastian Verhulst on drums and yet more backing vocals. The band had a fantastic, full sound - which some three-piece outfits seem to lack - and the vocal harmonics, which popped up every now and again, were spot on. The added comedy value of the strong French accents and a bit of good-hearted Anglo-French banter with the crowd made for a very relaxed and entertaining atmosphere.

For me, the highlight of the set was a rendition of Steppenwolf's "Born to be Wild". Now, I know what you're thinking, but this was truly a small piece of genius thanks to an absolutely fantastic drum solo from Sebastian. Indeed, after a few drinks, I was hailing him as the best drummer in the world and while clearly that might not be accurate, there was no doubt that he was quite exceptional behind the kit. I really do hope these guys return to Guernesey and are better received than they were this time around. We all moan about the lack of nightlife and entertainment in this island, so how is it that acts such as these dip under the radar? Come on people, get out of those cocktail bars and let's have a proper party. I for one had been truly Jet Blasted.

I climbed down and during all March, I travelled the length and breadth of fantastic Ages in the company of explorers from the MystPedia neighbourhood.

So, I took a book, but as I do not know the Art of Writing, I used my piano keyboard to express myself, instead of a quill and D'ni ink.

Thus, L'Age des Sons (The Age of Sounds) is a book written with music and sounds, in the spirit and atmosphere of what can be heard in the musics of Myst and Uru.

Having recently joined the wonderful community of Myst Online: Uru Live, and subsequently, the URU Karaoke family, she has rediscovered how much she truly loves singing. Turjan Aylahn (Alain Pachins)

About

D'marnah was a music project about D'ni music. A kind of Archaeomusicology in "IC" Roleplay and, in real world, a project of "Crypto-Archaeomusicology" ... from a French neighborhood called DMR (D'ni Musicological Research and later, Music Restoration Council) you have a blog steel online: D'marnah | Liquid Light (wordpress.com) https://dmarnah.wordpress.com/

I have started with an instrument I have built myself and called Ahnomehprad ("water from rock") but in fact, it's an "Euphone", an Harp "Glass bowed" created by the german acoustician Eernst Chladni (Chla D'ni ???) and a Duduk (Armenian oboe) to figure the Marahlobe (the D'ni Oboe that Gehn played in Riven).

In D'Marnah we were 3 musicians... But unfortunately, I was not able to sufficiently motivate my two companions to develop other music and other instruments with me (I had a D'ni Harp project and a Lithophone). I actually recorded the final album alone and there were only two shows. The album doesn't really reflect the idea I originally had in mind.

The Album tiltle "Liquid Light" refers to the name of the very first site https://web.archive.org/web/20050210001719/http://www.liquid-light.net/zandi/stone/profzandi/ that the late Jeff Zandi used to call the first visitors to the Cavern. I don't see what I can tell on this album, apart from:

- The piece "11/16" is a piece of music composed in 11/16, i.e. 11 quavers per measure (therefore an asymmetrical pattern)...
- Pan te shem is inspired by Traditional Hungarian music and
- The King Kerath March is inspired by medieval Cantigas and
- Hovern Egan (the wind was dropped) is a traditional Armenian piece used by Jack Wall for the Myst3 soundtrack (and by Peter Gabriel for "the Last temptation of Christ")
- · Lehm Rehmal (ink flow) is a tribute to the music of Philip Glass

Another project that does not appear on any album: it was "trying" for voice research and for submission to the **D'ni Linguistic Fellowship**:
